SHOW SCHEDULE

Thursday, November 2nd

2 – 4 p.m. Youth Sheep Show Ewe/Market Lamb Check in

H.N. Lewis Barn will be open to receive sheep from 2 to 4 pm on Thursday, November 2nd. Barn will be bedded with wood shaving. Stalls will be assigned by county. All sheep shall be inspected, classified, and check in/weigh in by 4 p.m.

6 p.m. Youth Sheep Show – Premier Exhibitor Exam

Premier Exhibitor Exam, formally known as Supreme Competitor, will be giving in the Ed Teague Arena.

Youth Sheep Show – Breeding

Followed by Showmanship

Followed by Market Lambs

Followed by County Groups

All animals will be released after the show. Early release of animals will have to have special permission from the Species Committee.

YOUTH LIVESTOCK SHOWS GENERAL RULES

1. Exhibitor will have to make entries online at www.alnationalfair.org under the competitions link. There are instructions on how to enter your livestock under this link. Online entry deadline will be Sunday, October 1, 2017. Late entry deadline will be Sunday, October 15, 2017 – no substituting, changes, or late entries will be accepted. No Exceptions!
2. Entry fee for the Youth Livestock Show will vary per show. Please see the diagram below on what your entry fee will be:

3. Upon receipt of entry, each livestock exhibitor will receive a complimentary 10 day wristband. All other family members will be required to purchase a 10 day gate passes for admittance to the Fair or a one day pass (prices may vary daily). Passes will be sold at the Livestock Gate Entrance for \$15 each (children 5 and under are admitted FREE.) **ALL PASSES WILL BE AT THE LIVESTOCK GATE.** We will no longer mail them.
4. Truck and trailer stickers will be required for livestock exhibitor at a cost \$5. They may be purchased online or at the Livestock gate upon arrival.
5. All Youth Livestock shows are for Alabama Youth residents **ONLY**.

6. Documented injured or handicapped exhibitors may receive assistance in the show ring by an age-appropriate volunteer if approved by the show committee. An age-appropriate volunteer is anyone meeting the age requirements of each event. Exhibitors are required to show their own animals, unless an exhibitor has more than one entry in the same class. In the event, an age-appropriate volunteer may show the other entry in show. No exhibitor may receive unauthorized assistance in the show ring. Livestock that are unruly and not under control of the exhibitor or are a disruption to the show, the judge, other exhibitors, and/or animals will be excluded from the show ring.
7. Each exhibitor must furnish their own watering containers. Community or common watering facilities are prohibited.
8. The Fair will provide space and wood shaving for the first bedding only. Hay, Feed and additional bedding will be the responsibility of the exhibitor.
9. Exhibitor quarters must be kept clean. Exhibitors who fail to do so will be asked to remove their animals.
10. Positively, NO open fires, charcoal fires, grills, cooking or food preparation will be allowed in the barns, pens, displays, or show areas.
11. All animals will be exhibited at the owner's risk. Feed and care is the responsibility of the exhibitor.
12. Award checks will be ready week of November 20th, and checks will be mailed to the address provided on the online entry.
13. Exhibitor agrees to hold harmless and to indemnify the Kiwanis Club of Montgomery, its officers, directors, and members; the Alabama National Fair and Agricultural Exposition, Inc., its sponsors, its officers, directors, employees and volunteers, and the State of Alabama for any claims, demands, or law- suits of any nature whatsoever involving loss of livestock or injury to livestock or exhibitor's personnel or for any actions by exhibitor's personnel. The owner and/or exhibitor is fully responsible for all his livestock and other properties, and the Fair is not responsible in any way for such live- stock and properties. For damages or injuries that may be done to, or suffered by, said exhibitor, he, she, or they shall have redress against that person or persons causing damage or injury, and not against the Alabama National Fair and Agricultural Exposition, Inc., or the Kiwanis Club of Montgomery, or the State of Alabama.
14. The Fair's Coliseum Boulevard Gate will be open at all times so that those wishing to see livestock events may gain admittance without inconvenience. Admission tickets will be required.
15. Showmanship classes are divided up into 4 divisions for Sheep, Swine, and Goats. Youth exhibitors will enter age appropriate divisions based on their age as day of show.
 1. Beginner (Ages 4 to 8)
 2. Junior (Ages 9 to 12)
 3. Intermediate (Ages 13 to 15)
 4. Senior (Ages 16 to 19)
16. To be eligible for Premier Exhibitor you must compete in the Skillathon Quiz, Judging, Showmanship, and exhibit an animal. Youth exhibitors will enter age appropriate divisions based on their age day of show.

Youth Sheep: Beginner (Ages 4-8), Junior (Ages 9-12), Intermediate (Ages 13-15), and Senior (Ages 16-19)

Youth Swine: Beginner (Ages 4-8), Junior (Ages 9-12), Intermediate (Ages 13-15), and Senior (Ages 16-19)

Youth Goats: Beginner (Ages 4-8), Junior (Ages 9-12), Intermediate (Ages 13-15), and Senior (Ages 16-19)

Youth Beef: Junior (Ages 9-12), Intermediate (Ages 13-15), and Senior (Ages 16-19)

Breakdown of Points:

25% Based on a 25 question (species specific) Skillathon Quiz

25% Based on Judging Classes/Questions (2 placing classes and 1 set of 10 questions on 1 of the placing classes)

25% Based on the placing in showmanship

25% Based on the **single** highest placing animal (can be **either** a breeding **or** market animal)

**YOUTH SHEEP SHOW
GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS**

Exhibitors can submit 6 entries BETWEEN the Market Lamb and Breeding Sheep Show. Exhibitors may show a maximum of four (4) per show. Examples: Three (3) Market Lambs plus (+) three (3) Breeding and/or four (4) Market plus (+) two (2) Breeding and/or two (2) Market plus (+) four (4) Breeding.

1. The Alabama National Fair Sheep Show will consist of a Market Lamb Show and a Breeding Sheep Show. All breeds and crosses are eligible. Ewe lambs can be shown in the Market Lamb Show or in the Breeding Show but the same ewe lamb cannot show in both shows. Painting is not allowed.
2. All breeding ewes, to be eligible to show, must be born between December 1, 2015 to June 1, 2017. Ram lambs born January 1, 2017 to June 1, 2017 are eligible to show. Non registered rams are allowed. Rams are not required to be bred and/or born at the exhibitor's farm. All rams will compete in one class, with no competition for rams above class. Commercial ewes will be (weighed and) shown by weight.
3. Market lambs (ewe lambs and wethers) must possess milk teeth and have suggested minimum weight of 70 pounds to be eligible to show in the market show.
4. County pens will be assigned and all sheep will be stalled in the assigned pens and remain overnight in the H.N. Lewis Barn. All sheep are required to remain in the immediate vicinity of the Lewis/Teague complex. Exhibitors are not allowed in the horse barns.
5. All sheep exhibited in the Alabama National Fair are required to have a Scrapie ear tag.
 - A. Non-registered breeding sheep and market lambs will be identified with a scrapie ear tag.
 - B. Registered breeding sheep will be identified by a flock ear tag matching the registration papers.

All breeding sheep exhibited should be enrolled in the "Scrapie Flock Certification Program" Sheep enrolled in the Scrapie Certificate Program cannot have intimate contact or be penned with non- enrolled animals or animals of lower status. A representative of the State of Veterinarian's office will inspect all sheep that come on the grounds of the Alabama National Fair. Sheep showing evidence of untreated lamb fungus will be treated on site. Sheep with active lesions may be subject to quarantine or returned to farm.

6. County groups shall consist of five sheep (any combination of breeding sheep and/or market lambs) owned and exhibited by three (3) or more participants from the same county. County Groups awards will be given to the County Group leader/ representative.
7. Breeding classes will be broken as evenly as possible by the committee after all entries have been received on October 15, 2017. Registered sheep will be shown by age. Non-registered sheep will be weighed and broken into classes. Market Lamb classes will be determined by weight. Commercial ewes will be weighed and shown by weight.
8. All sheep exhibited at the Alabama National Fair Youth Sheep Show should be the property of and under the direct care of the exhibitor by **September 1, 2017**. All registered sheep must be the property of and recorded in the same name of the exhibitor or the exhibitor's farm name by **September 1, 2017**. Original registration papers issued by the breed association will be checked for verification of ownership. Only sheep properly registered in the appropriate breed association will be allowed to show in the registered breeding sheep classes.
